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Influence Of Educated Family Background On Children's Educational Development

INTRODUCTION:

In Education Commission Dr. Kothari has said, "The nation is being shaped in the classroom". It makes us aware of the importance of education and the vital role it plays in the progress of nation.

Swami Vivekananda says, "Education is the manifestation of the perfection in man. You cannot teach child any more than you can grow a plant. The plant develops its own nature. The child also teaches itself. But you can help it to go forward in its own way." As a plant needs fertile soil, sunshine, wind and rain to grow up similarly there are some essentials for the growth of child. According to Dr. Pande and Prof. Nande, "Though basic quality of an individual's brain is determined by heredity, development of the innate capacity depends on richness of environment, opportunities and encouragement available to the child".

Encouragement and opportunities are necessary for the development of children. When we think of the environment, it is mainly the social environment that affects the development of child. This social environment consists of parents, family members, their education, neighborhood, friends, teachers etc. Though all these things are important here, the discussion is held on one of the important factors given above i.e. education of family members.

EDUCATED FAMILY AND CHILDREN'S EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Generally, the children having educated family members progress much than those having uneducated family members. Children are highly influenced by their parents and they learn a lot of things from their parents. So, Mahatma Gandhi says, "Father is the greatest teacher and home is the greatest school". The educated parents knowing the value of the education motivate their children to take education. They give proper attention to their children's studies and performance at school. They help children in their studies. Efforts are taken to satisfy the curiosities of children. They understand that the development of children is not only physical but it is mental also. And it needs the appreciation of children's performance.

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Books, news papers, magazines, radio, T.V. such information providing materials are made available. Parents meetings at school are attended and inquiry is made about children's performance. Efforts are made for the overall development of children. Here an example can be given of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. He was from educated family. His father Motilal Nehru was a lawyer. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru became a barrister. Later on in 1947 he became the first Prime Minister of independent India.

In the families where parents are uneducated, education is not valued much. Enough attention is not given to the children's education. Generally, these parents admit their children at school because all parents do. Parents neither take much interest in children's performance and progress at school nor care for their studies. Children are not encouraged to study or to participate in extra-curricular activities. As parents are not aware of the importance of education, they do not show any concern about whether the child is making progress or not. They do not appreciate children even though they perform well in their studies. They do not feel the necessity of making available knowledge enhancing materials. Curiosities of children are not satisfied properly. Efforts are not taken for the overall personality development of children. Due to these things children cannot develop properly even though they have inborn talent.

But in some exceptional cases in spite of having uneducated family background children make remarkable progress. It becomes possible due to their uneducated parents. As these parents realize the value of education in life, they insist and encourage their children to take education. The parents of the great scientist and the former President of India Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam were also uneducated but they encouraged him to take education and today the whole world knows him as 'The Missile Man'.

In some cases, children's significant progress can be noticed even though their family members are uneducated and the circumstances are not favourable for their education. These self motivated children with their strong willpower and talent successfully cross all the hurdles. The well-known Marathi writer Dr. Anand Yadav has come from such family. His parents were uneducated as well as his father was hostile towards his education. But Dr. Yadav did not give up. With his hard work, patience and strong willpower, he completed his education.

In this way, education that is called 'the nectar' keeps importance not only in an individual's life but also in the life of the nation. Children are the future of nation. What is important for our nation is to educate the children properly and to prepare them to face this competitive world and for this parents should be educated themselves or made aware of the importance of education because this educational background and awareness influences children's education.

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
