Out of which 60 were working Women and 60 were non-working Women. For this purpose of investigation "Social Adjustment Inventory" by Dr. R. C. Deva was used. The obtained data was analyzed through 't' test to know the mean difference between working and non-working Women. The results show that there is no significant difference in social adjustment, social maturity and emotional adjustment level of working and non-working Women.
