•Implementation of the "har khet ko pani" and "Per Drop More Crop" under Pradhanmantri

- Sanctioned more than one lakh solar pumps.
- •Initiation of the Soil Health Card Scheme in order to increase the productivity energy.
- •Use of the Neem quoted Urea to enhance the soil productivity and stop the misutilization of the soil resources.
- •Declaration of the New Urea Policy in order to encourage and increase the domestic production.
- •Launching the Kissan T.V. channel to assist the farmers
- •Implementation of the Rashtriya Gokul Mission to have increase in productivity of 'Deshi Maweshi Nasal'.
- •In order to safeguard the long term security of the farmers, a strong step has been taken in World Trade Organization (WTO).
- •There is an increase in the volume of Agriculture loan to 8.5 lakh crores, so that this facility may be easily accessible to all farmers.
- •Enhncing the mobile governance through which till date one crore farmers have been sent 550 crores of SMS. This gives important information about the agriculture in terms of increase in

- productivity and production. This practice is going on at present as the season has come already.
- •The government has prepared the 'Unified National Agriculture Market' in association with states for rendering better facilities to the farmers all over India.
- •Initiative has been taken in terms of 'Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojna (PKVY) to enhance the bio-agriculture.
- Empowerment of the Sugar Producers by increasing the import duties.
- •Land Bill Amendment-13: through this Bill, government wants to give the increased compensation along with the facilities for road, cheaper houses and employment opportunities so that the living standard may be improved.
- Laying down Minimum Support Prices (MSPs) for select key agricultural commodities to ensure food security. Further to prevent fall in prices in the situation of over production. And secondly, to protect the interest of the farmers by ensuting them a minimum price for their crops in the situation of a price fall in the market.
- Government of India on June 25, 2014 increase the minimum support price for paddy and other foodgrains. The table speaks the fact:

- 5.Endeavoring to ensure adequate and timely supply of inputs and services such as agricultural credit, fertilizers, pesticides, seeds and implements to farmers.
- 6.Developing suitable strategies for rain-fed farming through people's participation for a holistic and integrated development of potential watersheds, and promotion of a farming system approach for augmenting the income and nutritional level of farming Communities.
- 7.Assisting the State Governments to improve agricultural extension services by adopting new institutional arrangements through the involvement of NGOs, farmers, organizations and agricultural universities.
- 8.Endeavoring to bring about the integrated development of markets for agricultural produce to safeguard the economic interests of the farming community.

AUTHOR'S CONCLUSION:

It is very encouraging steps taken by the government, who is pro-kissan in India. An effort has been made really to increase the productivity and production of agricultural commodities especially keeping in mind the increasing and explosive population. The Indian population is
